### Pastor's Corner

The Church Militant: Confessing the Faith

Holy Trinity Sunday starts us into the long season of the Sundays after Trinity Sunday, or, ordinary time. While it may be the non-festival half of the church year, it certainly is important. It is a time to learn and grow in the faith and Christian life.

Holy Trinity Sunday, which this year was June 4, kicks off the season reminding us that we confess and believe in the one, true, and only God. The history of the church since the coming of Christ has been confessing that "Jesus is Lord." That was the first and briefest confession of faith for the church. Just those three little words set us apart from the Jews who denied that Jesus was the Messiah and the fulfillment of the Old Testament. It also separates us from the pagan world, which confuses Creator and Creation by turning nature or man into a god. It is useful to see how the saints of God throughout all times have struggled to remain faithful, and how God preserved His Holy Word and Church. Many times, we are tempted to think that there was a "Golden Age" of the church where peace and tranquility reigned. We wonder, "When will all the arguing and fighting stop?" But the war between false teaching and pure doctrine will not cease until Jesus returns. In fact, this is precisely the mindset we ought to have here on earth, poised for battle with the whole armor of God. Every generation has the duty and joy to confess the faith. Here on earth, we are the Church Militant. Total peace, the Church Triumphant at rest, lies in the future.

Just think of even the church in the age of the apostles. It had plenty of struggles of its own, the battle between Paul and the Judaizers for example.

The church that has ceased to care about the fight for

pure doctrine is a church that is headed for trouble. None of us should become self-satisfied or complacent. Who in the apostolic church could have imagined that by the beginning of the 4th Century powerful forces within the church were claiming that the Son of God was merely a creature, made by God? Who would have conceived that the bishop of Rome would transform into the papacy and hold captive Western Christendom? Who would have thought 50 years ago that liberal Lutherans would one day support homosexual behavior and abortion? We should never underestimate the depth of sin and human depravity. But the beautiful story of the church is that the Lord of the church, Jesus Christ, rescues His bride. He continues to pour out forgiveness through the church, even though she is battered and torn by strife. Against heresy His Word constantly strives. By it, He raises up champions who point not to their own ideas or fanciful thoughts, but to the saving truth of the Gospel.

Paul, Polycarp, Athanasius, and Augustine -- these are just a few redeemed sinners that defended the faith and from whose stories we can gain much inspiration.




